

ACTIVITIES OF WOMEN CELL, 2017

1. With a view to fulfill the responsibility towards protection and maintenance of the Environment, the members of Women Cell, along with the students of the College planted trees in the College Campus as a part of celebration of International Women's Day, 2017. Besides this, two members of Women Cell along with 10 students attended the Awareness Programme organized by ACTA Women Cell, Jorhat Zone, in association with Women Cell, J.B. College, Jorhat on 8th March, 2017.

A Seven Day Entrepreneurship Development Programme on Agarbatti Making, Cushion Making, Candle Making, Mushroom Cultivation and making various items from Waste Materials was organized by Women Cell in collaboration with NESSIA for the final year students from 24th March, 2017 to 31st March, 2017. 28 students of Six Semester successfully participated and completed the training.
3. The Women Cell organized a District Level Students' Seminar on 28th June, 2017, for HS and College level students of the colleges of Jorhat district. The theme of the Seminar was "Population Growth and Environmental Degradation". Dr. Minakshi Phookan Hazarika, Associate Professor & HOD, Department of Geography, J.B. College, Jorhat was invited as the Resource Person for the Seminar. Twenty (20) papers were selected for presentation in the technical sessions of the seminar. The participants with best papers were given cash prizes and certificates.

The Women Cell, in association with Literary Forum, Mariani College organized a district level Bhupendra Sangeet Competition among the school and college students of Jorhat district on the occasion of Birth Anniversary of Dr. Bhupen Hazarika on 8th September, 2017. The winners were given cash prizes, trophy and certificates.
5. The Women Cell, in association with the NSS Wing of the College, provided relief in some of the severely flood affected areas of Jorhat district on 25th August, 2017. The members of the Cell distributed basic food items like rice, dal, biscuits, potatoes, milk, baby food, blankets, sanitary napkins, etc. among the flood affected people.
