IT WAS in the year 1966, Mariani College was established by the sincerest initiatives of a good number of benevolent public and academicians of greater Mariani region. It was a humble effort for imparting higher education in a large locality, flanked mostly by Tea Gardens and villages of backward people. Establishment of Mariani College is a very vital and important addition in the academic scenario of Mariani, specially imparting higher education. The Mariani College was brought under deficit system in 1975. The college took a daring step with a group of local enthusiastic people to introduce Science Stream in 1993. Now the college has the rare opportunity to have three full-fledged streams of Arts, Commerce and Science with major in various subjects. The college has two campuses i.e. Old and New Campus. Science and Commerce streams are still running in old campus.

At present, Mariani College is a full-fledged Provincialised College and occupying a vital position under the Dibrugarh University almost in all spheres of academic performances as well as in the area of sports and culture. Many students of this college are now strewn over different parts of N.E. India, and abroad with commendable position.

The college is already visited by the NAAC team for Re-accreditation in the last quarter in the month of April, 2017.

With long 50 years experience, the college is imparting quality education among all with the help of a bunch of experienced and highly qualified teachers. At present, the college has intake capacity of 2000 students covering all the streams.

COURSE OF STUDY

SCIENCE

In Addition to Compulsory subjects ENGLISH and MIL or Alternative English, student opted for Science Stream need to select any three subjects as elective and 1 (one) subject as Fourth Subject if desire from the following list of subjects —

[i] Physics

[ii] Chemistry

[iii] Mathematics

[iv] Biology

[v] Computer Science

N.B. : *Environmental studies is a Compulsory Subject for all the three streams of the Higher Secondary First-Year Courses.*

It is to be noted that the subjects selected in the H.S. First-year should be continued in the Second-year also and under no circumstances alteration of subjects will be allowed.

EXAMINATIONS

Higher Secondary 1st Year Annual Examination & Higher Secondary 2nd Year Test Examination.

Higher Secondary 1st Year Annual Examination will be conducted by the college authority as per guidelines provided by AHSEC. Students having more than 75% attendance shall be eligible for appearing in the Annual Examination.

Pass Marks for Higher Secondary 1st Year Annual Examination (As prescribed by the AHSEC.)

Grade A	:	60% and above
Grade B	:	45% and above (below 60%)
Grade C	:	30% and above (below 45%)

Higher Secondary 2nd Year Test Examination.

Higher Secondary 2nd Year students must appear Unit Test/Test Examination conducted by the college authority from time to time. Students not

appearing in the Unit Test/Test examination will not be allowed to appear in the final examination. No medical certificate shall be entertained.

For appearing in the H.S. 1st Year Annual and H.S. 2nd Year Test Examination, a student have their attendance as under —

- [i] More than 75% shall be allowed as regular student.
- [ii] Attendance from 50% to 74% shall be allowed to appear in the examination as a Non-collegiate student by paying the prescribed Non-collegiate fees.
- [iii] Attendance below 50% shall be declared as Dis-collegiate and he/she will not be allowed to appear in the 1st Year Final / Test Examination

UNDERGRADUATE COURSE

As per the Dibrugarh University Regulation of 2010, the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com programmes shall be of three-years duration, distributed in six semesters which started from 2011-2012.

Semester Classifications :

- [A] 1st, 3rd & 5th Semesters — Odd Semester.
- [B] 2nd, 4th & 6th Semesters — Even Semester.

Admission Criteria :

[a] Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) :

A student who has passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, OR an equivalent Examination (10+2) recognised as such by the University, shall be eligible for admission into the First Semester of the Six-Semester Degree Course in Arts in Semester system.

[b] Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) :

A student who has passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) in Science of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, OR an equivalent Examination (10+2) recognised as such by the University, shall be eligible for admission into the First Semester of the Six-Semester Degree Course in Science in Semester system.

[c] Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) :

A student who has passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) in Commerce of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, OR an equivalent Examination (10+2) recognised as such by the University, shall be eligible for admission into the First Semester of the Six-Semester Degree Course in Commerce in Semester system.

Structure of Courses of the Programmes :

All B.A., B.Sc., B.Com. programmes shall have the following components, viz.

[i] Compulsory Courses : These courses are the compulsory courses for all students of the programme concerned.

[ii] Major Courses / Speciality : Major courses shall be chosen by the students. The courses shall be optional and non-mandatory.

[iii] Non-Major Courses : Non-Major courses shall be chosen by the students, who do not opt for major courses.

[iv] Skill-based Courses : A skill-based course shall be mandatory for all students pursuing Non-major B.A., B.Sc. programmes. The college will offer the skill-based courses as per own infrastructure and human resource feasibilities.

* Each Paper under the semester is of 100 marks of which 20 marks is for Internal Assessment and in case of paper Project Work 80 marks is for Dissertation and-20 marks for Viva-voce.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

Internal Assessment shall be compulsory components under the course of semester programme for B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. courses.

- [1] In Internal Assessment, different tools may be employed such as written tests, assignments, group discussion, paper Presentation etc. suitable to the courses.
- [2] The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall have to compulsorily attend the process of internal assessment, failing which they will not be allowed to appear in the End Semester Examination.
- [3] There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment and 80% marks for End Semester Examination in each course during every semester.

The marks allots for Internal Assessment (20%) in each course shall be based on the following :

- [a] Sessional Examination I and II 50% of the marks allotted for Internal Assessment.
- [b] Seminar/group discussion 25% of the marks allotted for Internal Assessment.
- [c] Attendance 25% of allotted for Internal Assessment.

Provided that 1 (one) mark for attendance shall be awarded to the candidate falling under Non-collegiate category within the range of 70% to less than 80% attendance who are allowed to appear in the End Semester Examination of the concerned semester w.e.f. 2013-14 academic session.

Attendance :

- [i] A student who has less than 80% attendance shall not be permitted to sit for the End-Semester Examination in the course in which the shortfall exists. Provided that it shall be opened to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reason on recommendation of the Head/Director/Co-ordinator of the Department/Centre on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

- The Principal of the college / institute with recommendation of the Heads of the Department shall announce the names of all students who shall not be eligible to appear in the End-Semester Examinations in the various courses due to non-fulfilment of the criteria of internal assessment and attendance, and send a copy of the same to the University. In such cases, the student shall have to re-enroll in the relevant course(s) with the next batch.

Identity Card :

Students will get an Identity Card at the time of admission. They must keep their I-Card with them within the college campus. The college authority may ask for Identity Card whenever it feels necessary and any student fails to produce the same will be liable for punishment. Loss of Identity Card must be reported to the Principal immediately and apply for duplicate one after depositing necessary payment.

Library :

The College has a well stocked library with more than 20,000 text and reference books covering various subjects and of general interest. It also provides to the students some of the important journals, Magazines and Newspapers in the reading room. In addition to the central library, every department has a small library attached to it with some books and journals for regular use. The Commerce Department has a separate well-collected library maintained by Commerce Forum of Mariani College.

Moreover, it has a good collection of Encyclopedias relating to different subjects. For the benefit of library users, a xerox machine is also installed inside the Library.

Library Card is issued to students immediately after the admission is over. Students can borrow books against their Library Card for duration of 15 days only. The Library remains open from 10-00 A.M. to 4-00 P.M. in all working days and books are issued from 11-00 A.M. to 2-00 P.M. Only one book is issued against one card (two books for Major students). Mariani College Library took a positive step to facilitate the general public to utilize the books and journals every Saturday of each week in the afternoon session.

Similarly, the National Service Scheme (NSS) also provides opportunity to students to develop their personalities through community service. The students who have the commitment to serve the nation can join either NCC or NSS according to their interest. The college has some determination to open a new wing of Scout & Guide as per the guidelines of the Govt. of India as soon as possible and for this preparation is going on.

Laboratory :

The college has well-equipped laboratory in the department of Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Geography with all modern facilities to cope with the requirements of major standard.

Special Facility :

[A] Scholarship :

Hostel Facility :

**Information regarding Regulations of Dibrugarh University
For the Results & Progression of B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com.
Under the Course Programme of Semester System
w.e.f. 2014-2015 Academic Calender.**

1. A candidate shall be declared as passed a course when he/she secures at least 40% marks in each course in the End-Semester with at least 40% marks in each course in aggregate in the End Semester Examinations separately.
2. A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any End-Semester Examination upto Sixth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carry over course in the next regular examinations of those courses.
3. (i) A Candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any end semester examinations up to Sixth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed courses (s) as carry over course (s) in the next regular examinations of those courses.
(ii) If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semester, the result of the sixth semester examination of that candidate shall be kept withheld and his/her results shall be accounted only after he/she clears the courses of the previous semesters.
4. A student must clear all his/her semester examinations within 6 (six) years from the date of admission to the First Semester of any programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the student, viz. 1st and 2nd Semester Examinations shall have to be cleared in 6 consecutive chances, 3rd and 4th Semester Examinations shall have to be cleared in 5 consecutive chances, 5th and 6th Semester Examinations shall have to be cleared in 4 consecutive chances.
