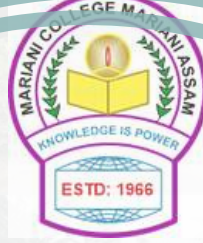

# Code of Conduct for Students

## **General Rules for Discipline Among Students**

1. The students admitted to the College must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the College Authority. Violation of rules and regulations, irregular attendance, discourtesy to the teachers and office staff etc. are some of the offences which may make students liable for disciplinary actions like termination of scholarship, non-award of College certificate/ diploma, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college.
2. The courses of study in Mariani College are full time courses. No student can pursue any other full time course simultaneously.
3. Use of Mobile phones by the students inside the College campus is strictly prohibited and disciplinary action will be taken in case of non-compliance with this rule.
4. The students must be in uniform inside the college campus and must wear the identity card.
5. The students must keep their bi-cycles, or any other vehicles in specified place for standing/ parking.
6. If any Poster, Notice or Papers relating to certain information requires to be pasted inside the College campus, one must get prior approval from the College Authority.
